1. Updates on Catchment Area

- The COE team awaits the new New Jersey State Cancer Control Plan, which will be published soon.
- The most recent CCAB meeting was held last night. Dr. Ganesan was a speaker on cancer and precision oncology and his talk got a very positive response.
- The COE Program Liaisons will be compensated for their work through administrative supplements, and they will be invited to attend RLC meetings.
- The recommendation was made to add the COE Program Liaisons to the Program Leadership part of the Research Program pages on the CINJ website.
- Dr. Kinney and a colleague at VCU Massey Cancer Center recently discussed their Citizen Scientist Programs. Some community members had thought one had to be a citizen to be a participant in the Program. Therefore, Program's name is being changed to the "Community Scientist Program".

2. Updates on CCSG

- Dr. Matthew Mattes has done research on DEI, specifically the lack thereof, in radiation oncology physicians. This research suggests that there should be more outreach to the medical schools that can reflect diversity.
- Dr. White asked about a comment made by Dr. Cristina Delnevo about CPC recruits appearing to be missing from a presentation recently made by Dr. Libutti to the Internal Advisory Board Meeting. Gina Londino-Greenberg explained that the IAB meeting slide set had included only a set of selected key recruits, for there had been so much recruitment into the CPC Program over the current CCSG funding period.
 - o The recommendation was made that the title of that slide be renamed to "Select Key Recruits" for the upcoming EAB meeting rehearsals.

3. Updates on CINJ Website

- For the Researcher Profile pages on the CINJ website, there needs to be a review of how Members are linked to other Rutgers University websites, for some may be very outdated or not active.
- Center Administration was also advised to ensure that no Members are listed without laboratory website pages.
