Course Description:

This introductory non-clinical course in nursing is designed to provide the student with a foundation in nursing knowledge that will provide the basis for ensuing theory and clinical nursing courses. Major foci will be the discipline and profession of nursing, its history, its conceptual and theoretical structures, and the patterns of knowledge needed for developing the science and practice of nursing. It will require the integration of previously acquired knowledge in the sciences, arts, and humanities, and will introduce basic concepts in epidemiology, demographics, cultural competence, as well as the knowledge necessary for a beginning understanding of the research process, and for development of interpersonal and interdisciplinary communication skills. The ethics and values of the profession as well as the scope of practice and other legal and regulatory aspects will be introduced. Current issues in nursing and the many roles of the baccalaureate prepared professional nurse will be examined and discussed as the student begins the transformation from layperson to professional nurse and becomes a self-reflective, accountable, lifelong learner given to self-appraisal as she/he navigates the route to achieving the terminal objectives of the curriculum.

Objectives:

At the completion of the course the student will be able to:

- 1. Articulate the roles and responsibilities of the professional nurse compared to other members of the healthcare team (I, VIII)
- 2. Understand the historical evolution of the discipline and profession (I, VIII).

- 3. Explore the conceptual and theoretical structures and patterns of knowledge that contribute to the science of nursing (I, VIII).
- 4. Describe the process of critical thinking and the nursing process (I, II, III, VI, VIII, IX).
- 5. Discuss state and national statutes and regulations that define the profession such as: Code of Ethics, Standards of Nursing Practice and other legal and regulatory aspects of providing nursing care (I, II, III, V, IX).
- 6. Describe nursing's advocacy role in caring for diverse populations across the lifespan, accounting for health status, culture, spirituality, and other individual and group characteristics and needs (I, VI, VII, VIII, IX).
- 7. Develop beginning interpersonal and interdisciplinary interaction and communication skills (I, II, VI, IX).
- 8. Perform literature searches using various data bases that contribute to evidence-based practice (I, II, III, VI, VIII, IX).
- 9. Examine selective issues in nursing such as: safety and quality (QSEN), genetics/genomics and nursing, IOM Report on The Future of Nursing (2010), Healthy People 2020, health disparities and health informatics/technology integration (I, II, III, IV, VII, VIII, IX).
- 10. Understand the terminal objectives of the curriculum and how the student will prepare to become a life-long learner to foster professional growth and development (I, IX).

Assignments Descriptions with Rationales

Please refer to Canvas for Expanded Descriptions and Directions (student is responsible in checking Canvas every 24 to 48 hours)

1. Part 1: What is a Nurse? Assignment

This assignment requires that you read Chapters 1, 2 and 20 in your Hood (2018) book. This paper has 2 parts:

- 1. **Interview:** Select 3 individuals who are not in the nursing field. Interview these 3 individuals asking the following questions:
 - What is a Nurse?
 - How do nurses make a difference in the lives of others?
 - What stereotypes, if any, do you know about the nursing profession?
 - What type of education is required to be a nurse?
- 2. Include what YOU believe nursing is in your final paragraph.

Ask yourself, What does it mean to be a nurse?

Deliverable:

- Write 1-page summation of your findings and upload on Canvas.
- **Bring a copy of your paper to class** and be prepared to share it with your colleagues.
- Try to use APA formatting with your paper. You will not get points deducted for APA formatting **this week**. We will discuss APA formatting more in-depth during Week #2.

3. Part 2: Why do I want to be a nurse?

Writing Goals: Understand how the student will prepare to become a lifelong learner to foster professional growth and development.

This assignment requires that you reflect on why you want to be a nurse. Please refer to the APA 6th edition book AND Canvas Week #2 module for additional resources.

Ask yourself the following questions:

- 1. What motivated me to become a nurse?
- 2. Why did I pursue a BSN in nursing (versus a diploma or associates degree)?
- 3. How will having a BSN affect my future nursing career?

Deliverable:

- Write 1-page APA-formatted essay about why you have decided to pursue nursing as a career.
- Bring a copy of your paper to class during Week 2 and be prepared to share your paper with your colleagues.
- This submission MUST be written using APA formatting.
- Critique of writing and APA formatting will be conducted during this class period.
- Include a title page, 1-2 page body, and a reference page.
- A revised version of this paper is due at the end of Week #2

4. Part 3: Which ethical issue most aligns to my nursing philosophy and why?

- 1. Review the ANA Code of Ethics document and identify a nursing Provision (s) that most aligns with your nursing philosophy.
- 2. Provide an example to demonstrate this.

Deliverable:

- Write a 1-page APA-formatted essay.
- Bring a copy of your paper to class and be prepared to discuss your paper with your colleagues.
- Include a title page, 1-2 page body, and a reference page.

5. Part 4: Which nursing theorist and nursing model aligns with my nursing philosophy and why?

- 1. Review Chapters 5 and 6. Select one (1) Nursing Theory and one (1) Nursing Model from Chapter 6.
- 2. Outline the Key Concepts of each and Discuss how the Theorist and the Model closely align with your nursing philosophy.
- 3. Provide examples for each.

Deliverable:

- Write 1-2 page APA-formatted essay addressing guidelines above
- Bring a copy of your paper to class and be prepared to share your paper with your colleagues.
- This submission MUST be written using APA formatting.
- Critique of writing and APA formatting will be conducted during this class period.
- Include a title page, 1-2 page body, and a reference page.

6. Part 5: My Overall Nursing Philosophy:

- 1. Review Chapter 3, pages 68-71, in your Hood text.
- 2. Answer the following questions regarding your personal nursing philosophy.
- 3. Go to Table 3.3 on page 70 and respond to your personal key concepts of nursing: How nursing is a scientific discipline to you, and your valuation of nursing as your career path.

Deliverable:

- Write 2-3-page APA-formatted essay describing your vision as a future professional nurse.
- Include the nursing career path you wish to enter and why that is your goal.
- Bring a copy of your paper to class and be prepared to share your paper with your colleagues.
- Critique of writing and APA formatting will be conducted during this class period.

7. Final Assignment and Presentation- Final Paper Parts 1-5 along with a PP presentation.

This is your final paper based on Parts 1- 5. Professor and peer feedback must be incorporated and demonstrated throughout the paper as part of the final product. This paper must be typed, in APA 6th edition formatting, be prepared to present via PowerPoint during the final two weeks of class.

Grading Scale:

A course grade of A, B+, or B* is required for progression in the nursing major.

A 90 to 100 B+ 85 to 89 B 80 to 84*

Assignment/Exam Grades:

Final theory course grades are calculated using the above weighted criteria. *There will be no rounding of exam grades*. Final grades will be rounded at the discretion of the Faculty instructor.
