- 7. If you have produced computer output, make sure it is, if not outright *pretty*, at least comprehensible, as in, appropriately aligned,* and reasonably labeled.**
 - E.g., if the output includes a table reporting t-values and p-values, the t-value should appear in the “t-value” column and the p-value should appear in the “p-value” column.
 - ** Variables should be labeled by what they are. They should not be called “variable” or “var1.”
Score on an IQ test might be labeled “IQ.”

EXTRA CREDIT

SPSS v. R

Up to 2 points per HW assignment.

For those of you who wish to program in R, you get an automatic 2 EC points if you produce and write up identical results using R & SPSS.

- 1 point for a reasonable attempt
- 2 points for an attempt that succeeds.

But you must:

1. Hand in all programs and output
2. Write up whether your results were or were not identical, highlighting the relevant results in both SPSS and R that led you to your conclusion that the results were or were not identical.
3. Please copy and paste all R code and output into a Word file.
