






myRUN Supportal







You will either click on "Submit Your Inquiry" button to create a new case (web form), or click on "My Cases" to view the status of an open case, or to view older cases that have already been resolved.




Tracking Your Cases


myRUN One Stop Virtual Counter



FERPA – Privacy of Student Records

- Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)
 - Federal law since 1974
 - Provides for confidentiality of student records
 - With only a few exceptions, your educational records may not be released without your consent
- Please be cautious with information you give out


RU Here pop-up takes place during fall + spring semesters and winter + summer sessions.

Once you log in to any RU website that requires Net ID and password login, you will be presented with a pop-up window where you will be able to confirm your enrollment plans. You will either select the "Yes, I am attending..." option OR the "No, I am not attending" option, which will drop you from all your registered courses for that semester. RU Here? – Cont'd

The Financial Responsibility Statement (FRS) is a mandatory agreement accepting financial obligations and responsibilities for attendance. If you have a valid FRS on file, you will not be prompted to "Agree" to the terms of the FRS.

Unable to see the RU Here pop-up?

Here are some reasons why you may not be able to see the RU Here pop-up

1. Logging in with RU ID # instead of Net ID

 A couple of our online web platforms provide you with the option to log in with either your 9-digit RU ID number or your Net ID and password. Please make sure you are signing in with your <u>Net ID and password</u>.

2. You need to disable the pop-up blocker

 Disabling your pop-up blocker with then allow the RU Here pop-up to appear when you log in with your Net ID and password

3. You are not yet registered for classes

• Students who are registered for classes for the semester in which they are looking to answer the RU Here pop-up should be able to get the pop-up. If you are not yet registered for classes. You won't see it.


4. The pop-up hasn't gone live yet

- The pop-up goes lives around 5 days before classes start. This date differs between undergraduate, graduate and law school students. Exact dates have not been published yet, but you will be notified.

RU Here Important Dates:

- A week before classes begin RU Here goes live for ALL students
- Two weeks into the semester <u>DEADLINE</u> to complete RU Here
- Students who have not completed RU Here by the deadline will be deregistered
- EVERY TERM : Year Round even for Summer & Winter
- Example: Spring 2023
 - RU Here went live: January 4 (GR) January 11 (UG)
 - RU Here Deadline: February 1
 - Deregistration: February 2

- FAFSA 2022-2023 uses 2020 tax return data
- FAFSA 2023-2024 uses 2021 tax return data
 - Use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool to avoid errors, and possibly be exempt from verification

- Half-time Enrollment at least 6.0 credits in RBS
- Valid Social Security Number

Student Loan Requirements

- Students and their families may find they need to borrow loans as a supplemental way to finance their education. No separate application OR credit check from a bank or other lender is needed to receive Federal Direct Student Loans.
- Students must complete Federal Direct Loan Entrance Counseling <u>and</u> a Master Promissory Note.



- 1. Go to www.studentaid.gov
- 2. Login with your FSA ID
- 3. Select complete Entrance Loan Counseling
- 4. Select complete Master
 Promissory Note and then
 Subsidized and Unsubsidized
- 5. Completion timeframe is about 45 minutes

Federal Student Loans

Federal Direct Unsubsidized Loan

- Principle is deferred while enrolled
- Interest WILL accrue while the student is in school.
- Payments are not required until after 6 month grace period
- Loan fee charged by Department of Education is 1.057%. Subject to change.
- Interest rate is for loans disbursed after 07/01/2022 is fixed at 6.54%



Federal Graduate PLUS loan

- Requires a separate Grad PLUS application and PLUS promissory note.
- Is subject to a credit check.
- If denied, student can appeal or add an endorser
- Student can borrow up to the maximum Cost of Attendance/Budget
- Also requires at least half-time enrollment [all federal student loans do]
- Interest rate is for loans disbursed after 07/01/2022 is fixed at 7.54%

Payment Options

Pay Online By Electronic Check

You may pay by e-check, which is an electronic withdrawal from your checking or savings bank account. No additional fee is charged for the e-check, unless the electronic payment is returned as unpaid from your bank to the university. If your e-check is returned as unpaid from the bank, a \$60.00 returned payment fee is assessed. The \$60 fee consists of a \$50 administrative fee and a \$10 returned check charge assessed by our payment processor when a payment fails. You may also be assessed additional late fees if you fail to make payment by the due date indicated on your student statement of account.

Pay Online By Credit Card

MasterCard, Visa, American Express and Discover Card may be used to pay tuition and fees online. A service fee will be assessed to your credit card for this convenience. In-person credit card payments are no longer accepted by the Cashier's Offices at the University.

Payment Options

Credit Cards (online only)

- <u>A nonrefundable 2.7 percent service fee</u> of the total amount paid is assessed by the credit card company.
- Visa, MasterCard, American Express, and Discover cards are accepted for online payments.

<u>Electronic Checks (recommended + online only)</u>

- E-check transactions are electronic withdrawals from either your checking or savings bank account.
- <u>Click to view</u> instructions for completing the e-check payment process via your online student account.

Paper Checks (recommended to mail)

• Personal checks are accepted through the mail. Indicate the student's name, telephone number, and RUID number on the front of the check.

Payment Plans

Payment Plans

- The table below shows Spring 2023 payment plan options.
 - The plans are monthly with automatic deductions from a personal bank account via e-check, credit card or debit card payment.
 - Plan payments are automatically processed on the 15th of each month
 - All credit card payments processed will incur a 2.7% service fee.
 - Additionally, there is a \$50 enrollment fee per semester which is nonrefundable and due at the time of
 enrollment.

Remission

TA /GA/ Fellow Remission

- Eligible TA/GA's receive remission for tuition, campus fee, school fee, technology fee, new student fee, and course fee (when applicable). All other charges the student is responsible to pay.
- Eligible graduate fellows or students receiving departmental scholarships will receive remission for tuition only. All other charges the student is responsible to pay.

• Eligible staff/faculty will receive remission for tuition only. All other charges are the responsibility of the staff/faculty member using tuition remission

Dependent Tuition Remission

- Eligible dependents will receive remission for tuition only. All other charges are the responsibility of the students using tuition remission.
- Students in a 4 year undergraduate program are eligible for 10 terms of remission, including 1 summer.
- Students in a 5 year undergraduate program are eligible for 12 terms of remission, including 1 summer.

Student Health Insurance

- Rutgers University requires <u>all students enrolled full time</u> and all <u>F</u> & <u>J</u> Rutgers visa sponsored students to waive or enroll in the Student Health Insurance Plan <u>each semester</u>. The Health Insurance premium is automatically added to the term bill every semester.
- Student Health Insurance Premium is automatically added to the term bill every semester
- Students must waive or enroll online each semester (Fall and Spring) at www.universityhealthplans.com
 - Waiving? If a student has comprehensive health insurance, they may complete the waiver form each semester before the deadline to get the premium removed from their term bill.
 - **Enrolling?** Paying the premium on the term bill is not enrolling. A student must complete the enrollment form each semester *before* the deadline to finalize the process.
- Students should wait 3 business days after registering for classes to complete the waiver or enrollment process
- Must waive or enroll before the deadline.
 - Spring 2023 Deadline: February 10, 2023
 - Coverage from 1/15/23 8/14/23

Barnes & Noble (B&N) Book Fund

- Eligibility: Financial aid recipient with expected refund of \$500+
- Provided when total offered aid exceeds directly billed charges by \$501. This
 first \$500 is sent to campus bookstore so students can purchase their books
 without having to wait for a refund
- Students are <u>automatically opted in</u> and must opt out if they don't do not want the book fund
- Students can opt out by logging in to your student account and checking your status
- B&N will price match through Amazon, bn.com and local competition

Refunds

- Students may receive a refund based on financial aid, loan credits or overpayments to their term bill.
 - Students who are receiving financial aid will have their aid applied to their term bill. If the financial aid award exceeds the balance due, students may receive a refund
 - Refunds will be sent via direct deposit (recommended) or paper check (7-10 business days to receive) by mail.
- Note: All Parent PLUS loan credit balances that are refunded to the parent borrower will be mailed by paper check to the parent's address listed on the PLUS loan application.

 signed up for direct deposit with the Parent's account information, PLUS
 refunds will still be sent to the Parent via paper check.

RU ID Card Service Center


