The original *Society, Culture, and Drinking Patterns*, edited by David J. Pittman and Charles R. Snyder and first published in 1962, was acclaimed as the best and most comprehensive sociological collection in the field of alcohol studies. *Society, Culture, and Drinking Patterns Reexamined* is an outgrowth from the original and attempts to update the many topics covered in the first book. In so doing, this book fills a large gap in the literature by providing an up-to-date reader on the diverse issues that social scientists address in studying alcohol use and alcoholism.

The current book (40 chapters) is organized similarly to the original and includes reviews of research and original empirical studies. It also includes reprints of classic chapters from the original volume plus other important studies.

*Society, Culture, and Drinking Patterns Reexamined* provides professionals and students in alcohol studies, social problems, deviance, etc., with a comprehensive examination of alcohol use and alcoholism from a sociological perspective. It will serve as a reader in undergraduate and graduate courses, as well as an important resource to researchers and lay persons concerned with society, culture, and drinking patterns.

The presence and partial cultural integration of alcohol, which is a potent psychoactive substance, raise a myriad of sociological issues. Despite the attraction of biological explanations of alcohol dependence and alcoholism, alcohol use and perceived costs and disruptions associated with such use remain issues for sociological investigation and analysis.

This collection of 16 papers written by prominent social scientists was conceived to honor the contributions and record the influence of Selden Bacon on sociological studies of alcohol use and alcohol-related problems. It offers a range of perspectives on where we are today in this research and offers some explanation of why we are where we are. Much of the work addresses Bacon's plan, which combined the theories and methods of sociology with the varied phenomena associated with the consumption of alcohol. The plan itself is reprinted here for the first time since its 1943 publication.

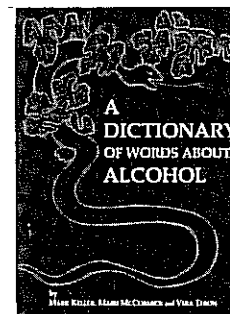
### Drinking and Intoxication: Selected Readings in Social Attitudes and Controls.

This volume examines social drinking in an effort to understand better its motivation and its results. Drinking as one aspect of family recreation and sociability has been a means of strengthening familial and social bonds. In such circumstances, drunkenness does not become an end in itself. Reduction and, if possible, elimination of the excesses attributed to intoxication remain desirable objectives. But repressive measures sanctioned only by law have not been workable in the past and there is little likelihood that they will operate successfully in the immediate future. Drinking practices have their roots in group culture, and controls are likely to emerge only through consent of the group as a whole. The selections in this volume suggest ways by which restrictions have been applied in the past, some with success, others futilely.

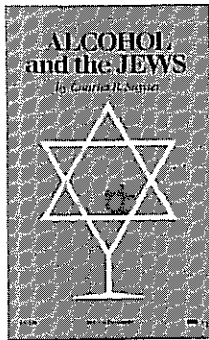

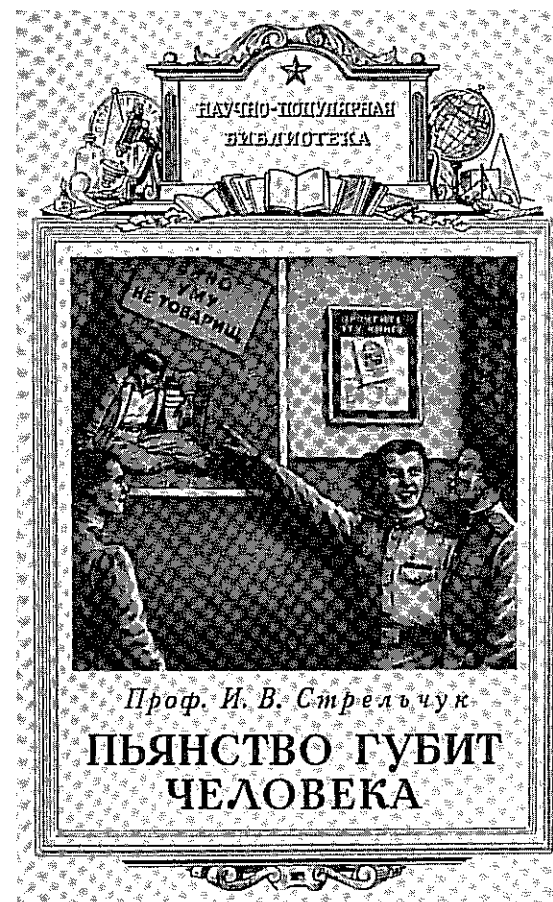

"Drinking is the joy of Russia," declared Grand Prince Vladimir over a thousand years ago. Despite the fact that Russian drinking reflects many traits of the mysterious "Russian soul," this new book offers a rare examination of the role of drinking in old Russia and the cultural and psychological roots of contemporary alcohol problems. The review of pre-Revolutionary Russian society covers important topics unknown to most Western readers, including: the tsarist alcohol policy; the role of Russian religious and secular ceremonies; the drinking styles of various social and ethnic groups, women, and teenagers; and the incidence of alcoholism and its impact on crime, accidents and suicide.



In the 1950s the extent of drunkenness was such that Soviet authorities instituted an anti-alcohol campaign, despite the official view that alcoholism was a "vestige of capitalism." Whether government can limit heavy drinking is one of the questions addressed by B.M. Segal in the new *Russian Drinking Practices*. 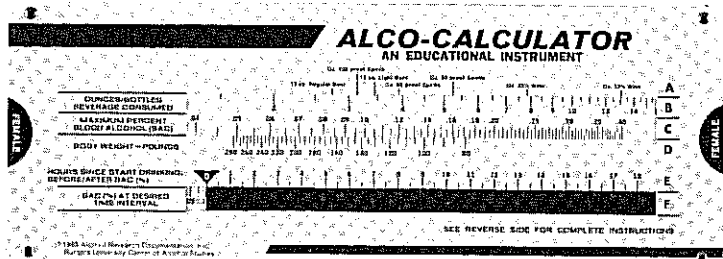

# alco-calculator



The alco-calculator is a handy slide rule which estimates blood alcohol concentration. The slide rule contains complete instructions to (1) estimate the amount (per cent) of alcohol in the blood after drinking known amounts of beverages; (2) estimate the minimum number of drinks consumed from the concentration of alcohol in the blood; (3) calculate and compare the alcohol values by the number of drinks of different types of beverages; (4) estimate the concentration of alcohol over time; and (5) estimate the time necessary for a particular concentration to fall to a desired level. One side of the slide calculates the blood alcohol values for men, the other side, for women. Includes revisions by David Lester.

**CONTINUING EDUCATION PROGRAMS**

The *Continuing Education Seminars* provide employed professionals advanced training in alcohol, drug, and related fields. The topics are chosen to enhance and augment the knowledge and skills of a range of human service professionals from a variety of disciplines and settings. These one-day programs are offered on Thursdays and Saturdays from October through May.

The *Employee Assistance Institute* is a newly developed program for professionals responsible for identifying and helping employees with problems that are interfering with their job performance. The Employee Assistance Institute series is offered on Mondays from October through May.

**SUMMER PROGRAMS**

The *Advanced School of Alcohol and Drug Studies* is a one-week program for professionals working in the alcohol and drug fields. Advanced-level courses, state-of-the-art updates, and reviews of current research will enhance knowledge and skills in selected areas of interest. Admission prerequisites are listed in the catalog (available upon request). Rutgers University grants 3.5 Continuing Education Units for the Advanced School, equivalent to 35 contact hours toward certification/recertification in most states.

The *Summer School of Alcohol Studies* is an intensive two-week program of specialized courses taught by leaders in the alcohol field. Each student attends two courses in the morning; general lectures and special interest seminars are held in the afternoon. In the evening there are lectures, films, social activities, and self-help fellowship meetings. Rutgers University grants 8.0 Continuing Education Units equivalent to 80 contact hours toward certification/recertification in most states.

The *New Jersey Summer School of Alcohol and Drug Studies* is a one-week program offering basic knowledge and training courses, as well as advanced courses, for both lay and professional persons whose work brings them into contact with problems related to alcohol and other drugs. Lectures and special interest seminars are also part of the program. The school is approved for 3.5 Continuing Education Units or 35 contact hours toward certification/recertification in most states.
